

QUIZ 1 OVERVIEW

Note: All vocabulary that you will be asked to analyze and/or define will consist only of boldface words found in the readings or on the worksheets assigned so far.

>SECTION ONE: DEFINE KEY TERMS

3 questions, 2pts ea - 6 pts

You will be asked to match three of the four terms of Word Building given on page 5 with their correct definitions.

>SECTION TWO: NUMBER WORDS

10 questions, 1pt ea - 10 pts

Exactly as done on the Numerals Worksheet: for each English word you will be asked to provide the numeral base and the Arabic numeral that corresponds to it.

EX

hexagon Base: hex- Arabic Numeral: 6

>SECTION THREE: SINGULAR TO PLURAL AND VICE VERSA

10 questions, 1pt ea - 10 pts

Exactly as done in the homework for Tuesday the 4th: you will be given a Latin or Greek word that has come into English with its endings unchanged (not naturalized) and you will be asked to change the word from singular to plural or from plural to singular.

EX:

Alumna → *Alumnae* Theses → *Thesis*

>SECTION FOUR: ANALYZE AND DEFINE

8 questions, 3pts ea - 24 pts

Each word will be provided in the context of a sentence. You must break the words into their parts and define the meaning of each part (1 pt each). Then, using your breakdown of the word AND the context which the sentence provides, select the best logical definition of each from the four provided choices (1 pt).

EX:

Claudia has lots of dictionaries and is always reading something. For that reason, people often say that she is a logophile.

Component and its meaning: log- : say/word _____

Component and its meaning: -phile : one who loves _____

Best definition:

- a) A person who loves words
- b) A person who loves books
- c) A person who loves logic
- d) A person who loves logs

>SECTION FIVE: MYTHICAL ALLUSIONS

5 questions, 2pts ea - 10 pts

You will be given an incomplete expression that relies on a mythical allusion. You will need to choose the correct phrase from a word bank to complete the expression.

EX:

That bathroom is disgusting! Cleaning it up would be like cleaning up the Augean stables.

>Section Six: Gods and Goddesses (5 questions, 2 pts. ea -10 pts)

For each god or goddess listed, say whether it is a Greek or Roman god (.5pt), their role (.5pt) and an English word derived from their name (1pt)

EX.

Venus: Roman goddess of love, desire and beauty; Venereal.

>**SECTION SEVEN: NUMBERS AND LETTERS (10 QUESTIONS, 1 PTS. EA - 10 PTS)**

For each Roman numeral supply the corresponding Arabic numeral and for each Arabic numeral supply the Roman version. For each Greek character supply its name.
